TRAINING ACTIVITY B-4 Individual Differences in Teams





All individuals are unique. People learn and are likely to perform at their best in environments where their **individual differences are understood, respected and celebrated** in daily interactions with others.

One way that people differ is in how they prefer to direct their personal energy and attention. This may be described as being *extraverted*, *introverted*, or a combination of both.

After completing the activity on the following page, discuss the following questions:

- How do these E-I preferences manifest during staff discussion meetings or problem-solving sessions?
- How can these preferences be used to help develop positive and resilient team environments?

Communication Strategies:

Introverts communicating with extraverts can:

- Focus on actions over deliberations
- Ask open questions that support sharing ideas
- Be open to sharing ideas spontaneously

Extraverts communicating with introverts can:

- Provide questions for discussion ahead of time so ideas can be thought through in advance
- Allow for airtime in conversation so everyone has an opportunity to share
- Interact in both written and oral formats

	Carefully form ideas before talking about them
	Usually wait for others to make the first move
	Like to observe things before trying them
	May not initially share their thoughts and feelings with others
	Pause before answering questions
	May seem reserved and quiet
